### One definition:

Anti-social, individualized ideology that blames the other on social problems while seeking its salvation from a strong man leader.

#### Another definition:

Explicit racist, bigoted, hateful attitudes towards others.

A problem with definitions:

While white supremacist beliefs are often coded as extremist, they are also baked into all of our own structures, including our unions.

- Rise of "extremes" in relation to the centre

What we're calling extremism today is an intensified, individualizedeology that many Americans and Canadians have lived under for generations

For this presentation, we will explore extremism as it relates to individual union members who might express ideology consistent with ...

Angry hatred: Racist, anti-Semitic, sexist, homophobic, xenophobic, bigoted, etc.

Problems defined by conspiracies: COVID-19 is fake, BLM is a Marxist plot, QAnon, Pizzagate, etc.

Solutions: insurrection, Trumpism, right-wing of the GOP or Conservative Party

- · Comments, flyers, angry social media posts
- Campaigns against vaccination, human rights
- Organizing to run for positions within the union
- Acute acts of violence or harassment among workers

## What might attract someone to the far right?

- Loneliness, isolation
- Easy answers
- Radicalization through online platforms
- Family members or friends
- Need for belonging
- Justify hateful opinions

## What might attract someone to the far right?

- Crumbling social conditions
- Lack of services
- Online communities/belonging

#### Individual:

- Loneliness, isolation? Build community and bring people together.
- Easy answers? Popular education
- Radicalization through online platforms? Popular education, supports for worried family and friends, forums on the process of radicalisation

#### Individual:

- Family members or friends? Popular education, locations for discussion/debate, support networks
- Justify hateful opinions? Anti-racism popular education, anti-racism campaigns
- Online communities/belonging? Create real-life communities

## Systemic:

- Crumbling social conditions? Fight for social justice both through collective bargaining and in the community
- Lack of services? Advocate for service improvements, consider the union as a location where services could be delivered

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## Systemic:

- Livable communities
- Better working conditions
- Real-life community building

## The far right vs. the far left

History shows that the only ideology that can meaningfully fight the far right is the far left.

Labour in and of itself is not a far left institution, but elements within labour can be.

## The far right vs. the far left

#### Labour must

- Understand itself as a bulwark against fascism
- Fight accordingly
